
He is a proud bookworm who is passionate about creative writing. He uses his experience as a primary school teacher to inspire kids to write funny all across Australia and Asia.




#### **Author Biography 1**







Lisa Nicol is an author who sometimes makes documentaries. Lisa sees books and films as different ways to tell a story.

Lisa loves to foster creativity and uses music, stories and audience participation in her school presentations.


The other thing she loves to do is hang out with her kids. They love animals and pretty much every family holiday revolves around tracking some down. And she has a mutt called Spencer.


